Dear Parents/Guardians:

Parent-led programs at IRIC can only continue with your support

Parents of Iron Ridge Intermediate Society (PIRIS) is a fundraising society at Iron Ridge Intermediate Campus. The money raised through this group of passionate parents makes possible multiple programs and items that enhance students learning at the school.p

That includes:

Hot Lunch Program Sports equipment for exercise and play, Outdoor classroom equipment and activities, and much more

PIRIS has raised more than \$45,000 over the past four years, not including \$300,000 that was raised by PIRIS parents and the community for the school playground.

As students grow up and leave Iron Ridge Intermediate, their parents, understandably, also move on from our school community. To ensure PIRIS survives these transitions, we need new parents ready to lend a hand.

PIRIS is a crucial fundraising society for Iron Ridge Intermediate, but without these new members on the executive, PIRIS is in serious jeopardy of not being able to continue its important work into the 2020-2021 school year and beyond.

We need your help!

WE URGENTLY NEED PARENTS to take on the executive positions of PIRIS, and ensure this group and its many vital contributions continue.

How does PIRIS Support IRIC?

Parents of Iron Ridge Intermediate Society (PIRIS) was formed four years ago, primarily as a fundraising society. PIRIS continues in that capacity, successfully securing an AGLC license for raising funds through Bingos and Casinos. These are important for large scale fundraising projects, such as the school playground.

PIRIS has organized and been responsible for the IRIC's Hot Lunch Program, where families have the option of ordering hot lunch meals for their children twice a month.

Additionally, pancake breakfasts and barbecues for students have also been a success through PIRIS.

What happens if PIRIS folds?

If there is no one to fill the executive positions on PIRIS, then the group will lose its society status and the ability to fundraise through bingos, casinos and other large scale methods. Successful programs such as the Hot Lunch Program will no longer be viable. And, the funds raised for programming and crucial items to enhance student learning will be lost.

What is needed to ensure PIRIS continues to operate?

What we need most are parent volunteers ready to take lead roles on the executive of PIRIS. The positions consist of: President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Secretary, Casino/Bingo Chairperson, and directors.

What kind of time commitment is expected?

There are one hour monthly meetings for the executive.

For the executive and additional parent volunteers, there is a bingo once per month (and that schedule is important, as it took two years to get into that rotation). In addition, the executive and additional parent volunteers will be needed when IRIC's turn comes up for a Casino (once every 3 years).

What are the benefits of being a part of PIRIS?

The benefit is knowing that your commitment is making our school community a better place for our children and families. Through sports equipment, iPads, books, projectors, art supplies, music, etc., PIRIS has contributed to enriching the environment of IRIC, which our past members are very proud to have been a part of.

Please seriously consider filling one of these positions on PIRIS in order for this important work to continue to help serve our children and their education.

Executive Positions

President

- Presides and runs all meetings of the Executive and the AGM
- To be signing authority on all bank accounts
- Bring forward any fundraising suggestions
- To oversee all fundraisers and events
- To be responsible for agendas

Vice President

- To support the president and be prepared to fill in for the president if required
- To assist in the organization of fundraisers, Bingos, etc.
- To have signing authority on all bank accounts

Treasurer

- To keep and maintain all financial records and books for the society
- To pay all authorized obligations of the society
- To submit regular financial statements
- To be signing authority on all bank accounts
- To fill out the Annual Society Return for Alberta Registries
- To fill out the gaming financial report as requested by Alberta Gaming, with the help of the Casino chairperson

Secretary

- To keep and maintain the minutes of the Executive and AGM meetings
- If necessary, submit a write up for the monthly school newsletter
- To conduct such correspondence as may be required by the president (example: thank you letters)

Casino/Bingo Chairperson

- Correspond with Alberta Gaming on all changes made to the executive
- Complete applications for future casinos
- Ensure we have enough volunteers for casino/bingo commitments
- Ensure money that is spent through gaming proceeds meets both the organizations mandate and Alberta gaming authorized use of proceeds.


